ENGAGE IN EVERYDAY MOMENTS TOGETHER



Morning Time

As your kid starts their day, let them know about something they said or did that encouraged you.



Meal Time

At a meal this week, have everyone at the table answer this question: "Why do your words matter?" At the end of the discussion, spend some time encouraging and affirming one another with your words.



Drive Time

While on the go, ask your kid: "Tell me about one thing you did today that made you feel proud (and why)."



Bed Time

Pray for each other: "God, help us use our words wisely. Let us not be careless with our words when we are hurt, angry, or even hungry. Help us to honor you and others with what we say and how we say it."
